Alarm Communications

Now is the Time to Stop Relying on POTS Lines

AT&T wants out of maintaining landlines in Illinois and is asking the state legislator to scrap requirements that the company maintain land-based phone lines. AT&T must get permission from Illinois and a number of other state legislatures before they can formally ask the Federal Communications Commission to be allowed to scuttle the thousands of miles of land-based phone lines. The bill is currently awaiting a Senate floor vote.

“It’s taking a large investment that could be spent covering the majority of their customers for wireless or IP-based phone services,” said Brent Skorup, Technology Fellow with the Mercatus Center.

According to the National Center for Health Statistics, only four percent of Illinois residents still rely solely on landlines. But skeptics of the plan worry about access to rural areas covered by AT&T. Skorup contends the fears about people being without any service are largely unfounded. In 2015, the Ohio state legislature voted to allow all major telecom companies to withdraw from their basic landline services.
